Our purpose is to create places where people love to live with sustainable communities built to last. We do this by partnering with land owners, local authorities, public sector bodies such as Homes England, institutional investors, and affordable housing providers. We take pride in meeting the needs of society and we care about the health and prosperity of the communities we work in.

We have set ourselves a goal to work together with our partners to create sustainable communities that enhance the quality of life for over one million people by 2030. This Charter sets out the principles that will guide us in achieving that goal.

## Our 5 guiding principles are to:

<b>1. Listen and learn</b>	Speak to people in the community to find out what they want and need and then use this understanding to create shared plans
<b>2. Support local businesses</b>	Strengthen the economy by working with local businesses
<b>3. Employ local people</b>	Provide employment opportunities for local people from all backgrounds and develop the next generation of community creators
<b>4. Support local causes</b>	Help make a real difference by supporting local charitable, social, and environmental causes
<b>5. Build sustainably</b>	Leave the environment in a better state than we found it and build homes fit for a low carbon future

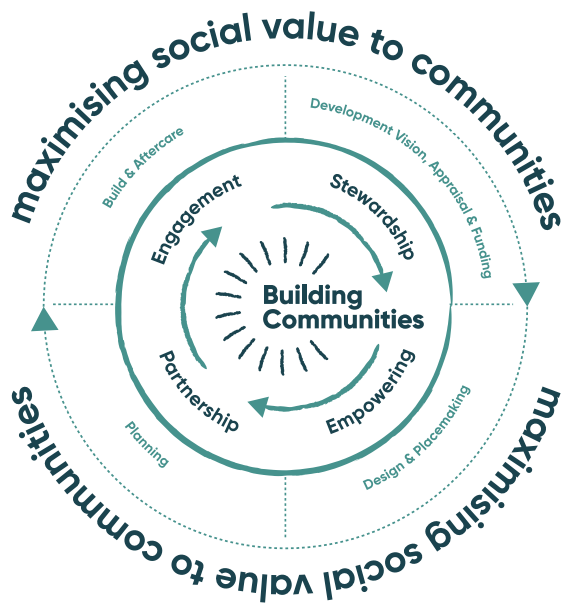
## Reporting progress

### Development Vision, Appraisal and Funding

Together, co-creating a shared and innovative vision for each development project.

### Design and Placemaking

Designing developments with care that respond to local needs and nurture diverse, sustainable communities.

### Planning

Delivering on planning requirements and working with local government to build high-quality homes, better infrastructure, and opportunities for thriving local economies that meet planning needs.

### Build and Aftercare

Taking pride in building capacity and skills to create more homes and communities built to last and keeping our customers and stakeholders at the heart of what we do.

## Targets and Measurement

To make sure we stay on track to build sustainable communities, we have set targets that drive positive social impact. We aim to:

- Generate 30% social value across Countryside every year;
- Develop local job-creation, training and employment support plans across the whole of Countryside by 2025;
- Have 5% of our own workforce participating in apprenticeships, traineeships or graduate roles;
- Achieve the Living Wage Foundation accreditation;
- Achieve a 10% net biodiversity gain on all our developments by 2025; and
- Plant 250,000 trees across our developments by 2025.

## Keeping this Charter up to date

This Charter is publicly available on our website and displayed in our workplaces. The Charter is reviewed annually and performance against our targets is reported in our annual Sustainability Report.
